### **President's Report for AGM—March 2015**

My first year as your elected President has been a varied one. I had plenty of committee members, but was lacking in the executive positions which are vital to our organization and its smooth running of the day to day activities. Thankfully and to my humble surprise several members came forward and showed their commitment to our Club and its continued success. Specific jobs were allocated to Committee Members who took these on board and ran with them. A few committee changes have occurred over the year due to Members leaving and a slight reshuffle. I know that the outgoing committee members have given their all over 2014/2015 and I hope some will nominate again for 2015/2016.

Even though last year was not our exhibition year, it turned out to be a very busy year. This included our 30<sup>th</sup> Birthday celebration and challenge which went off well. Membership has been stable with currently around 104 members. Sit and sew days on Thursday and Fridays have been well attended along with Saturday Stitchers. Christmas Club once again made and delivered a beautiful raffle quilt for our Christmas Party and they also get a great crowd to their sewing days. The Committee and I would like to thank everyone involved for their wonderful work and contribution to the Club.

Our annual raffle went well and proceeds less costs were donated to Motor Neuron Disease. Thanks to everyone who sold tickets and sat at the Royal Darwin Show. Your time and effort is greatly appreciated. The Committee would like to thank Judy Anictomatis who made the 2014 raffle quilt. This fund raising event would not be possible without the generous support of our Members. A raffle quilt is presently being constructed by our generous Members from Quilters Down The Track for our 2015 raffle and tickets should be available in April. Tickets for this raffle will be sold at Fred's Pass Show, Darwin Royal Show and our TQ15 exhibition.

The Valuation committee has been very active in 2014/2015 holding valuation days and recruiting trainee valuers and holding classes each month. This should improve our valuation service greatly in the future when the trainee's become educated in valuating quilts. Our Judge for TQ15 (Jan Frazer) will be running a two day workshop for the current and trainee valuers on her visit, so that will bring us in line with the rest of Australia.

Alison McShanag has made contact with several suggested Tutors and is in the process of working out a three to four year plan to bring Tutors to the Territory. Alison has worked very hard on this issue and I hope that the Members will acknowledge her hard work by putting their names down and attending the workshops once they are announced. The success of this program is up to YOU as Members and will determine its success and continuation.

The Quilts of Love program and Community projects were very successful with Quilts of Love being sent to most hospitals in the Territory on request and several beautiful quilts donated to the Women's Shelter. The Committee would like to thank the Members who contributed to this program and we welcome any donations of Quilts of Love at any time.

The Mt Bundy Retreat was very successful in 2014 and is already booked out for 2015 which is our 10<sup>th</sup> year of heading down the track for the Mayday week-end. Members who attend enjoy the chance to strengthen friendships, good wholesome food and plenty of sewing. I would especially like to thank Members who donate goods for the raffle, food and the camp cooks who make sure everyone is made comfortable and well catered for. Without them the retreat would not be possible.

TQ15 is well in the planning stages with the venue booked and Categories and Awards placed in Snippets. Volunteers for white glove duties, selling raffle tickets, hanging of the exhibition and generally helping out will soon be called for. Please consider putting some time aside to help the TQ15 committee and make the exhibition successful.

I would like to thank Helen Tate for her tremendous contribution to the Club in collecting, collating and producing our monthly Snippets for all Members to enjoy. Several Members have said to me that they enjoy getting Snippets every month and cannot wait for it to come out. It is a credit to you Helen.

Our extensive library is run by Beverley Lee who does a tremendous job cataloging new books purchased and keeping track of books on loan. Beverley also looks after all the archiving for the Club. Once again these jobs are done effortlessly and the committee thanks Beverley for all her hard work.

As President I would like to thank our 2014 Committee who have worked very hard keeping the Club ticking along. These positions are voluntary and I know that a lot of hard work is put in to ensure the success of our organization. ### AUSTRALIAN COUNCIL OF QUILTERS CONFERENCE REPORT 2015

Held in Perth (Western Australia) 22<sup>nd</sup> February – 24<sup>th</sup> February 2015

Jan Cashion (President and Voting Delegate) and Kim Tait (Committee Member and Non-Voting Delegate) attended the Australian Council of Quilters conference in Perth on behalf of Darwin Patchworkers & Quilters Inc. We arrived in Perth on Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> February and were picked up from the airport by a WA Guild Member and transported to the city. We attended a meet and greet at 5.30pm where we could mingle with the other Delegates. A buffet meal was served at 7.00pm and everyone went to bed fairly early to get ready for our 8.30am start the next day. The conference ran for the next two days from 8.30am until 5.00 to 5.30pm. A lot of topics were discussed which I will attempt to convey to everyone over the next couple of months. If anyone has any questions about the topics, please feel free to give me a call or ask at the next ordinary meeting.

### EXHIBITIONS

This topic was quite extensive with the following points mentioned:

#### Interstate Entrants

Some Guilds allow interstate entrants but the entrant must have been a member for at least two years and must attend five ordinary meetings and the AGM.

#### Modern Quilts

Tasmania does not have a category for Modern Quilts. Queensland has a sub-committee to decide if a quilt should be exhibited in a Modern Quilt section. Most other Guilds allow Modern Quilts to be exhibited, but not judged.

#### Sponsorship for Awards

- Some States are now asking for cash prizes for sponsorship, as in a few instances they have received poor quality prizes from Sponsors.
- The general feeling at the conference was that the quality or quantity of the sponsor's prize should not be the determining factor. All that should count is that the quilt maker has received a ribbon and been recognised as a winner of the category. All States and Territories are struggling to obtain sponsorships these days and any offer of sponsorship should be gratefully accepted.

### **TERMS & CONDITIONS**

- 1. Stallholder Fee's are outlined in the attached. Payment is to be made by Bank Transfer upon receipt of Tax invoice. Placement in the markets is not guaranteed until payment is received.
- Cancellations must be received no later than 14 days prior to the market date to qualify for a refund. A \$20 administration fee will apply. Permanent stallholders that cancel individual stalls may be required to pay additional casual rate loading.
- As part of the Territory Government requirement to trade on their land all Stallholders must hold a current Public Liability Insurance for \$10M. Stallholders may opt to include insurance in their stallholders fee – see schedule of rates.
- 4. Food sellers must provide copies of all relevant Food handling/ Kitchen licences to the organisers with their application form.
- Food stallholders are required to discuss waste management requirements with Territory Made management. Stallholders are required to comply with Territory Made's waste management policy. Additional fees may apply.
- Stallholders must provide their own tables, tablecloths and Marquees/umbrellas (if required). Tablecloths are to be white, beige or a neutral colour to keep a unified "look and feel" for the market. Stallholders must endeavor to maintain a high standard of presentation for their stall at all times.
- 7. Stallholders agree to maintain and deliver a high standard of customer service at all times during market hours.
- 8. Stallholders must design and handcraft their products in the Northern Territory.

### TERRITORY MADE

- Participation in the markets is by invitation only. Stallholders must comply with minimum standards for presentation and sales of products. Stallholders must provide visual evidence of their products at time of application.
- Stallholders agree to promote the markets on their social media pages, websites and through other networks as appropriate. Stallholders agree to represent the markets appropriately and positively in all public domains and forums.
- 11. Stallholders are not to park vehicles onsite during market times unless prior permission is arranged with management. Parking will be available on Gardens Rd and in the Mindil markets carpark. Vehicles are permitted onsite for the purposes of loading and unloading during select times. Stallholders may access the site for setup between 7.30am and 9.30am with stalls to be set up no later than 9.30am. Bump out will occur from 4pm – 5pm.
- The Stallholder Application Form must be completed and returned to Territory Made management no later than 28 days prior to the nominated market date or dates to be considered.
- 13. By participating in the markets all Stallholders agree to abide by the stipulated Terms and Conditions provided above. Failure to comply with these terms may result in termination of participation in markets.

#### Permanent Stall Holders

Permanent stallholders are those that participate in all six markets from April – September 2015. These rates include:

- Public liability insurance
- Waste Management
- Security
- Venue Hire
- Power
- Site Management
- A listing on the Territory Made website

### "EVOLUTION, CHANGE, CHALLENGE – A CONTEMPORARY QUILT"

Exhibition to be held: Saturday, 29th August – Tuesday, 8th September, 2015

### CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES: 24TH July, 2015

The Quilters' Guild of NSW Inc. invite entries for a professionally hung, juried contemporary quilt exhibition to be held at Hazelhurst Regional Gallery and Arts Centre from 29<sup>th</sup> August to 8<sup>th</sup> September, 2015.

The exhibition is open to quilters and fibre artists from all Australian states and territories. Membership of the Guild is NOT a requirement of entry. There will be two prizes offered, a first prize of \$1500 and a viewers' choice prize of \$200.

Entries must address the title theme "Evolution, Change, Challenge: A Contemporary Quilt" and measure 70x100cm (WxH) portrait format. Judges will carefully consider the appropriate interpretation of the theme and design concepts applied, particularly the use of colour and value for all quilts entered.

The Guild exhibition, "Evolution, Change, Challenge – A Contemporary Quilt" is being held in conjunction with a curated exhibition of quilts at Hazelhurst Gallery and Arts Centre. "Labours of Love – Australian Quilts from 1850 – 2015" will display quilts sourced from The National Gallery Australia, Canberra, Powerhouse Museum, Sydney and noted quilters and fibre artists from across New South Wales.

Entry is via online entry form only and an entry fee of \$25 per quilt is payable. Entries close 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2015. Further information and online entry for "Evolution, Change, Challenge – A Contemporary Quilt" is available at:
