Many, many thanks to Alison McShanag and the Committee for organising her visit and to Alison for providing accommodation for Helen.
































From the Committee - June 2016

From time to time members miss announcements, updates and decisions made by the committee. We had a request for a summary of information from the AGM at the same time that we were thinking about ways to improve communication to members. There will be a 4 month trial to provide a summary of information 'From the Committee' in Snippets each month. This month is a bit long, but I hope to condense to no more than one page for the next few editions.

AGM (3rd March)

The AGM was attended by 30 members and 11 apologies were received.

Queries and Requests from members included:

Request for Financial Reports to be available in club rooms;

Response: Since November 2014 - each month's financial reports have been stored in the Minutes folder in the office/library of DPAQ Club Rooms.

Do members need to vote on the AGM date changed from March to April in 2016?

Response: No, the Constitution states: '43. (1) The Association must hold all annual general meetings within 5 months after the end of the Association's financial year.' The financial year end is 31st December, so the AGM can be anytime up until 31st May.

Elections:

One written nomination was received for each of the positions - President, Treasurer, and Secretary. For the 8 General Committee Members - five written nominations were received, one nomination from the floor and Cheryl West was appointed in May. There is still one vacant General Committee Member position.

Sewing Days Session Payments

To show our appreciation, members who volunteer, to either teach a Saturday Stitchers workshop or for cleaning 96A Winnellie Rd (as per 96A Anchor Tenant Lease agreement), will be exempt from paying the session fee. This is limited to:

Saturday Stitchers Tutor - 1 person;

Cleaning - 2 members (as listed on the roster in the kitchen).

If you do this, please continue to record your name in the Register for the session and note either (tutor or cleaning) and you don't need to include a payment.

There seems to be a misunderstanding about first time visitors at Sewing Days. Visitors pay the same amount as members at Thursday Threads Sit and Sew, Friday Stitchers, Christmas Club and Saturday Stitchers. First time visits at a <u>General Meeting</u> (i.e. the first Monday of the month) are free.

A 3 year plan for tutor/workshops - Alison McShanag is currently negotiating with Wendy Williams for 2016;

Managing the renewed 96A Anchor Tenant Lease requirements;

A review of Sub-groups to ensure we are working within the DPAQ Constitution and auditing requirements;

Planning for Darwin Show - members are asked to put their names down for a 2 hour session. It is best to incorporate the DPAQ session with your visit to the show. Arranged entries and refunds will not be possible this year;

Sub-committees & Others

The sub-committees have been extremely busy

<u>TQ15 Committee</u>: is in the midst of TQ Planning, such as the publicity - including banners, sponsorship, early advertising to members (see key dates on the notice at the Club and also on Website), Bernina machine prize, Best of Australia Quilts have been confirmed for display at the Exhibition. New streamlined guilt frames are being made.

<u>Valuation Committee</u>: Last met to value quilts 17th May - had 5 quilts to value at the open valuation day. All were issued with their valuation certificates on the day. One was a charity quilt (Darwin Women's Shelter). One out of session quilt was valued for RSPCA.

Next open valuation day will be held Saturday 29 August. This is planned to be just before the exhibition and will be promoted to members via Snippets. The TQ15 judge, Jan Frazer, will be doing a training session with the Valuation team in September.



War-Time Quilts Exhibition: Quilts from Military Fabrics – Annette Gero collection

July 3 - November 22, Manly Art Gallery, Sydney, NSW



This very rare collection of 'war quilts', made by active soldiers and prisoners of war from pieces of disused uniforms, army blankets and other military fabrics, includes quilts dating from the Napoleonic Wars (1803-15), the Crimean War (1853-56) and World Wars One and Two. A publication by The Beagle Press accompanies the exhibition.
