

Many thanks to Barb Mellon and Lesley Every for leading the workshop on making the 5 minute quilt blocks. Barb and Lesley did a great job with clear instruction and undertaking all the initial investigation which made this workshop possible; such as working out the sizes to cut the pieces - not identified in the YouTube video. We had great fun making a wide variety of designs with this simple and nifty idea developed by Susan McNeill in her '5 Minute Quilt Block' book. It makes triangles simple without having to match points - a definite bonus. Even better - the triangle is cut so the edges are on the bias which does not make the block more difficult to make but does mean a cathedral window look can be created. Some of the participants chose the more complex pinwheel design and did a wonderful job of the challenging task of matching points in the centre of the pinwheel. See the pictures for the variety of effects which can be created using this very simple yet versatile design.

The workshop was well attended by Kim Tait, Janelle Northcott, Irene Duncanson, Sue Duffield, Beverley Lee, Bernadette Izod, Rayma McMahon, Naomi Oliver, Jess Richards, Lyn Bates. Thank you to Lesley for her very tasty home made cakes and the other contributors of comfort food.

Suffolk Puff Angel (a hanging Christmas ornament)

Requirements:

Head: 1 x 25 mm wooden bead

Dress: piece of **fabric** 29 cm x 17 cm will make 5 Suffolk Puffs or use scraps of various colours

Wings: approx. 20 cm x 4 cm wide wire edged ribbon

Hanger and legs: approx $\frac{1}{2}$ m very narrow decorative **cord** – needs to be able to be threaded in a large needle.

Halo: 1 x star or flower button

Feet: 2 x bell shaped buttons or **beads**

Chenille (or doll) needle

Hand sewing supplies.

ADVICE FROM A SINGER SEWING MANUAL

FROM 1949

Prepare yourself mentally for sewing. Think about what you are going to do... Never approach sewing with a sigh or lackadaisically. Good results are difficult when indifference predominates.
