4 Patch Kaleidoscope Technique

This technique can be used to make any sized quilt or project blocks. The size of the 4 patch blocks is determined by the required completed block size ie. if a 5" finished block is required then the size of each 4 patch piece will be 3" (2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " plus seam allowances of $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side). Keep in mind the larger the block size, the greater possibility of losing the effect.

Requirements:

- You will need 4 repeats of a patterned fabric. It's best to choose a fabric with a large design but not too much background space.
- Construction thread to match
- Contrasting fabric for borders or sashings (depending on what you will make this technique up into)
- Cutter with new blade
- Ruler and cutting board.
- Pins and usual sewing notions.
- Sewing machine in good working order
- $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot

Saturday Stitchers September 17th, 12-4pm



Stash Buster Quilt as you go
With Janelle
Northcott

This is a project to help you use all of those left over scraps that may be useful some day. It will use QAYG stitch and flip method and then joined with sashing strips. If you wish, you can learn this method using scraps from the club and make a charity quilt.

Requirements List:

Fabric strips cut into any widths (left over parts of jelly rolls, that last bit of binding that you didn't use)

Wadding cut into 13" \times 13" squares (even if you have to join them to make the size)

Backing fabric 13" \times 13" squares (these can be in different fabrics)

Sashing fabric (I like to use plain to contrast the strips)

Threads to blend with the sashing and neutral thread for the blocks Sewing machine and general sewing supplies.
