President's Patch





With a bit it trepidation I embarked on my first workshop for Darwin Patchwork and Quilters showing participants how to do the 4 patch kaleidoscope which my father describes as Rotational Symmetry of Order 4!! It was a bit daunting to start with as I was presented with some 24" repeats (aghhh I hadn't prepared for those!!) but everybody got the hang and Janelle was a lifesaver as it was all hands on deck to start with.

The most rewarding part was the excitement of participants when their squares came together – I did say it was like magic J.

Some people chose to cut enough squares for full quilts and some for the cushions and some just came to see how to make them.

The work was wonderful and all so different, from Cathy's very subtle blue kaleidoscopes brought to life by the surrounding shadow box, to others who chose vibrant fabrics with distinctive colours and patterns.

Fifteen people attended the two day Mariner's Compass foundation piecing workshop and the results from all of these sessions speak for themselves – and even the food looked fabulous.




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I felt that with Territory Quilts coming up in September that this would be a timely addition to the newsletter.

Who's who in DPAQ - Susan Webb

This is a new piece in Snippets that will introduce members of the club to you - starting with our President

How long have you been quilting and how did you get started?

I have been quilting for about 20 years. When I first met my husband to be I was looking for a hobby. His mums best friend introduced me to it (thanks Barb Mellon) and its been a constant for me ever since. I now have a sewing room for the first time so am looking forward to spending more time in my own space. About 10 years ago I was invited onto the Valuation team and I have been very fortunate to learn a lot from those members and from valuing the quilts I've seen over that period.



This is my current project ... it's taking a while!

Who/what inspires you most in your techniques, style, colour choices, creative journey etc?

When I was first starting out I did a colour course at Frangipani Fabrics with Jeanine Marshall. It was all about using the colour wheel, no fabrics lots of coloured pens and paper. I think that was really important as the colour is the starting point which can make or break your

project. However if in doubt I always refer to my husband (he's actually got a good eye for colour). I love colour and seeing the combinations that people put together.

What's favourite piece of work?

I have a quilt that was a round robin with my friendship group - everyone had to add a boarder on it. My friend painted me an iris on fabric which I used as the centre and then the borders added onto that. My godmother is now hand quilting it for me - I can't wait to see it as it has had a little something added from so many wonderful ladies.

What course/further education/workshop/experience have you done/had that has made the biggest impact/impression on your textile work?

I was the Workshop convenor many years ago for DPAQ and I was able to secure 2 international tutors into Darwin -Esterita Austin (look up Misty Fuse – that's her product) and Emiko Tode Loeb - her class was a log cabin and we thought 2 days for a log cabin was insane but boy did we need those 2 days. They were both pretty special workshops and great to have international tutors in Darwin.

This was made for my nephew Kaelan (now 5) ... he loves frogs. The quilt now lives on their sofa and we always play hiding and cubby houses with it.



What would be one piece of advice you would give to someone starting their quilting journey?

Don't be afraid to ask for advice and soak up everyone's hints and tips. I went to Quilt Encounter in Adelaide a couple of times, have been to Melbourne and Brisbane with my friendship group and even though we had sewn or shopped all day, of a night we would go back to our rooms and the girls would all share hints and tips. I'm thinking quilting is about the friendships that you make and I've been very lucky to make some great ones!

What is your last/current/next project?

Oh my - I have so many UFO's that need quilting the list is too long. My friend keeps offering to quilt them for me so I need to get organised and send them to her. I love hand sewing, sashiko and stitcheries. I'm doing a hexagon quilt (still) and have lots of projects in the "to do" pile - I just need to retire so I can get some more time!



This quilt was made for my mum for her 60th birthday – lots of emotions attached. Thanks must go to the wonderful colour girls who sat around my kitchen table sewing the binding on – very much like a scene from 'How to Make an American Quilt'
