Who's who in DPAQ - Barb Mellon

How long have you been quilting and how did you get started?

I started quilting in 2001 when I attended a Beginner Quilter Class at Casuarina Night School. Soon after that I went to another beginners workshop at the Alawa Sewing Centre where I completed a Sampler Quilt. That was it I

was hooked. Soon after I attended a Colour Workshop with Jeannine Lucas and from that workshop most of the participants agreed to do a Row by Row Quilt. That was the beginning of the Friendship Group the Colour Girls. I became a member of Darwin Patchworkers and have been an active member since then.



What are you most passionate about in quilting/fibre art?

I love the feel of the fabric. I will often stroke a piece and agonise over how I could ever cut it. I find colour a very difficult thing to get right. I love Foundation Paper Piecing. I also enjoy needle turn applique, my preference is for Patchwork and Quilting is often difficult to enjoy.

Who/what inspires you most in your techniques, style, colour choices, creative journey etc?

I have attended workshops with some amazing International and Australian Tutors who have introduced many techniques that I would have never attempted on my own. I am also inspired every day by the Quilters who I sit with at our local Quilt groups. When they share ideas, these are the little gems that inspire me the most

What's your biggest accomplishment in quilting/favourite piece of work?

I think the things that take the most time are my greatest accomplishments. I like to have a project for each place. I usually do one project at the Clubrooms and that takes ages on only one day a week. I like the idea of arriving on the day and knowing exactly what I am going to do. The same thing applies for my projects at home in my 'Shed'. However I can be easily distracted there when I look at the many boxes of fabric that I have still to work through. I am particularly proud of the Challenges that the Colour Girls complete every year. We get pushed into many techniques that we would not usually attempt.

What course/workshop experience have you done/had that has made the biggest impact/impression on your work

I have attended Quilt Encounter in Adelaide for the last 9 years. The seminars and workshops are amazing. Every year I return with new skills and ideas. The tutors that DPQ bring to Darwin are also amazing; bringing the expertise to us at home is so worthwhile. I would encourage everyone who is able to attend visiting tutors.

What would be one piece of advice you would give to someone starting their quilting journey?

I would recommend taking a beginners course and then joining a group. Take it steady and get lots of help from more experienced Quilters. It's okay to ask lots of questions.

What is your last/current/next

I don't have a 'To Do List' I find that too frustrating to manage. I do have a system on my sewing room wall that has three columns Now, Next and Soon. I write each task on a post it note and stick it under the appropriate heading. Some things move from Now back to Next and Soon sometimes gets promoted. I don't feel any pressure with this system as often things need to go back down your list as other things get in the way.

SHEER ORIGAMI



Create you own version of this prize-winning quilt using hand painted silk organza. This layered original art quilt uses a combination of fabric painting and textile and paper folding techniques.

One to two day class In this workshop, you will create a totally original, exciting and vibrant quilt using simple fusing techniques with hand dyed or batik fabrics or scraps or even jelly rolls. Learn how to fuse fabrics and create a complex looking design easily with **no sewing**.

The only sewing in this quilt is in the quilting, which will be done at home after the workshop and will further enhance your unique quilt.

Skill level - Beginner to intermediate

PERMISSION TO PLAY



Have you always wanted to try out interesting surface design techniques and products without stress? This class can be held as a two to five day class and will explore a wide variety of surface design techniques. Course structure is flexible and can include techniques such as fabric painting, sun

printing, stamping, rubbing, foiling, stencilling, screen printing, textural free motion quilting and fabric collage. **Materials fee** includes all fabric and products for a fun and creative time.
