Rope Baskets 201 with Christine Garrett



Following the success of last year's class on Rope Baskets, Christine will again teach the basic basket and for those who wish to go further, she will teach the method of making bowls as pictured above.

Requirements list:

1 x hank 25mtr x 5mm cotton sash cord (available from Bunnings)

50 cm fabric (or scraps from another project)

Thread to match plus 2 wound bobbins

Size 14 needle

Sewing machine, general sewing supplies etc.

# Who's Who in DPAQ Janelle Northcott – Saturday Stitchers Coordinator

#### How long have you been quilting and how did you get started?

For as long as I can remember I have always been around fabric and sewing. My mother made her "pin" money by sewing wedding dresses and all our clothes were made by her. While she never gave me a lesson, I learnt by watching and use to make all my own clothes. Gradually this became too much of a chore and eventually I only made things that I couldn't buy.

I was always making things with any available materials around me but my first big adventure into sewing was crossstitch when I was on exchange in England in 1989. It was an obsession. Gradually I added other forms of sewing like hardanger until I decided to try patchwork. My first class in hand piecing was at *Stitch Witch* in Fannie Bay. After making the blocks and letting them sit for some years, I made my first quilt. No one had told me about sashings, so on that quilt the sashings were about 15 inches wide. "There are no mistakes in patchwork."

My next class was at *Frangipani* in Parap where I learnt machine piecing. From there on I have been mainly self-taught but I take in all the advice that I can glean from others. Many of the tips have come from incidental conversations. I try to attend as many of the workshops as possible that the club runs.

One of the things I try to do with each new project, is to try something new.

# *Who/what inspires you most in your techniques, style, colour choices etc?*

My nature is fickle so I don't remain loyal to any one inspiration. My work is mainly traditional patchwork and I love appliqué. Helen Godden inspires me with my quilting and I also get ideas from Angela Walters, Christina Cameli and anyone else on Pinterest. With appliqué, I have been trying to use different stitches on the machine to add some interest but I still love hand appliqué.

Modern quilts scare me as there is no plan. As I progress with my patchwork, I am trying to work out some designs that will suit the "traditional" me.

# What are you most complimented on?

Because I produce quite a lot and I do try different things, I do get complimented. I love it!! It gives me a great sense of achievement and encourages me to keep going.

# What's your biggest accomplishment/favourite piece of work?

My husband, Warwick, is my biggest fan and he was the one who encouraged me to enter my first Territory Quilts. Since then I have tried to enter each Territory Quilts exhibition as well as the Darwin Show.

My favourite piece of work changes from time to time. <u>Three</u> <u>Green Geckos</u> is probably the piece that gives me the most satisfaction as it was the first piece I designed myself even though I used a Helen Godden drawing. It started out as four geckos but the fourth one, a reverse appliqué, was not very good.

The part of quilt making that I enjoy the most is the quilting especially on my Sweet Sixteen. With each piece of work I can see my skills improving.



# Who's Who - continued

What would be one piece of advice you would give to someone starting their quilting journey?

There are no mistakes in quilting. If you like what you are doing then it is great – keep going.



#### What is your current and next project?

It is rare that I have one project at a time. Currently, I have two quilt tops ready for basting – one for my step-daughter and one for my granddaughter. There is also *Flight of the Dragonflies* which just needs binding, an EPP project for me to cart around and an appliqué, *Hummingbird Lane* as a shop sample for Dragonfly Fabrics.

After teaching for 36 years it is hard to stop. The difference now is that I love teaching those who want to learn and I love sharing something that I have discovered. It is not that I am an expert by any means, but I love to see the sparkle in the eyes of others when they cotton on to a tip I have been able to share. Saturday Stitchers is so enjoyable as everyone seems to enjoy that companionship of the day but I would like to have more people take a session so that we can have different angles on our passion for the art.

On Saturday, January 27 we had our annual "mystery quilt" workshop.


