
Supper Duties

A little information from Pam....

I've been teaching quilting and textile art for a long time, at least 25 years now. My ideas and techniques have changed a great deal over that time and I now work mainly from my own photographic imagery which I transfer to cloth in one way or another.

I see myself as a journalist in fabric. Each quilt tells a story.

I teach multiple processes in each quilt which adds to its distinctive effect. However, some of my quilts echo the traditions of traditional quilt making and a cultural distinctiveness.

I have been nominated and finalist as The ICAP teacher of the year several times. I'm yet to win the top prize, but I think being nominated by my students and peers is an honour. I was also lucky enough to win the Jewel Pearce Patterson Scholarship for international quilt teachers through IQA.

I've taught all over the globe and I love the challenge of teaching in another language. I'm thrilled to say that many of my students have gone on to become Tutors and proven winners in their own right and this teacher for one is very proud.

Who's who in DPAQ - Robyn McDonald

Committee Member

How long have you been quilting and how did you get started?

My introduction to the "Art of Quilting" commenced just over 10 years ago. My cousin Jenny, who now lives in South Australia, was living in Darwin. Jenny encouraged me to go along with her to a Beginners class at Dragonfly when the shop was situated on Sabine Road. Jenny had been quilting for some time but me, well I was a complete novice! My husband had bought me a sewing machine as a surprise Christmas present some years previously so I could make myself "frocks" (I think he thought he could save himself some dollars!). Having no dressmaking experience, the machine was used to make the odd School Library book bag and borrowed by friends!

What are you most passionate about in fibre art?

As my friends would endorse, I am a fabric addict! I love visiting Fabric shops and have a considerable collection of different ranges from traditional to modern. I am also a member of two fabric clubs. Nothing delights me more than opening packages of fabric that arrive at my door.

Who or what has inspired you most in your techniques, style, colour choices, creative journey etc

I have been fortunate to attend many workshops and exhibitions since commencing my Quilting journey. Several years ago with two other DP&Q members, I participated in the Craft at Seas cruise to Fiji (unfortunately we never arrived there due to a cyclone, but that's another story). We had much fun with Wendy Williams, Michelle Marvig and Sue Daly as our tutors. I have had several trips to the Australasian Quilt Convention in Melbourne and undertaken workshops with Karen Styles, Deborah Louie, Helen Godden to name a few. In December last year, I attended a workshop in Adelaide conducted by Tula Pink. This was my first experience with a "Celebrity Quilter".





What course/further education/workshop/experience have you done/had that has made the biggest impact/impression on your textile work?

Every workshop I attend I believe I take a new technique or tip from. I love using felt (Wendy Williams), I can now Foundation piece (Michelle Marvig), I enjoy English paper piecing (Sue Daly and Karen Styles), I am more familiar with my Bernina machine (Deborah Louie) and continue to work on developing my free motion quilting skills on my Sweet Sixteen (Helen Godden and Paula Storm).

What would be one piece of advice you would give to someone starting their quilting journey?

Take the opportunities available to be involved with your club. Now undertaking my second stint on the DP& Q committee, I become more aware of what is happening in the broader Quilting Community. Participate in workshops. We are a fortunate to be members of a club that bring high quality Tutors to Darwin, especially for members that are unable to travel outside the Northern Territory.

What's your biggest accomplishment / favourite piece of work?

I completed Wendy William's "Around the Garden" Quilt in record time last year. I was holidaying on the Isle of Skye, Scotland in the winter so there was lots of indoor time. Some may say my embroidery stitches were a little bigger than what others may make, but I say this is my unique style. I was thrilled to win a Highly Commended ribbon at the TQ17 exhibition. I am slowly progressing with my Mrs Billings (currently in its 4th year) and Town and Country (currently in its 3rd year) quilts. I would like to add I have completed several smaller projects in the meantime!

What are you complimented most on in your work?

My willingness to challenge myself with new techniques.

What is your last project?

Tula Pink's Tula Nova quilt. So proud of completing a project in less than 12 months!





Please note that Naomi Oliver will be publishing the next two Snippets and will need to receive material for these to her email NOT the Snippets email. See earlier for her contact email.


