This Mug Bag pattern was developed by Annette Stacey, who passed away some years ago. Much of Annette's stash was donated to the club as has been used in charity quilts. This little bag is also great for a little girl's handbag.

Requirements

- A fat quarter of a print/colour of your choice
- 1 WOF x 1 ¹/₂" for binding (to contrast the fat quarter)
- flannel (or other soft fabric for lining) approx a fat quarter
- wadding (about a fat quarter)
- button
- sewing machine in good working order
- general sewing supplies



Pam Holland Workshops

How lovely it was to host Pam Holland again in Darwin, it was such a treat to see all of her wonderful quilts on display at the club rooms for the lecture where 25 or so keen quilters came to listen to her tell the stories behind her quilts, and her quilting journey. 

Hi everyone,


Quilters Companion has put out a Challenge for Northern Territory Quilters.



DFG creates washable feminine hygiene kits to girls & women that would otherwise go without. Enabling them to not miss valuable days from their education. DFG's also allows girls to protect their privacy and avoid being married by male members of the family at too early an age in some cultures, thereby increasing their age for their first pregnancy.
