Saturday Stitchers

Three Zippered Pouches Saturday 15 September 10 am to 4 pm Janelle Northcott

Three Zippered Pouches

With these pouches, the zipper is the star. Choose zippers that contrast or bring out the best in your chosen fabrics. They are designed to use a normal nylon dress zipper. The stoppers are the ends will be cut off hence the "or longer" tag in the requirements. Some hardware can be added to these pouches which I will have available. I like to use plain fabrics for my linings so you are able to see the contents of your pouch.

Triangular Pouch

This pouch uses only one side of the zipper so it is possible to make two of these from one zipper. I have extra zipper pulls available.

- 10" x 5" rectangle outer fabric
- 10" x 5" rectangle lining fabric
- 10" x 5" rectangle thin fusible wadding
- 12" zipper or longer
- 2" x 1¹/₂" rectangle to tab (optional)
- 7" x 1¹/₂" rectangle to cover inner seam

Teeny Tiny Pouch

- two 3¹/₂" x 5" rectangles of outer fabric
- two 3¹/₂" x 5" rectangles of lining fabric
- two 3¹/₂" x 5" rectangles medium fusible interfacing
- 7" zipper of longer
- two 1¹/₂" x 3" rectangle for tabs

Coin Purse

- two 5" x 6" rectangles of outer fabric
- two 5" x 6" rectangles of lining fabric
- two 5" x 6" rectangles of thin fusible wadding
- 7" zipper or longer
- two 2" x 1¹/₂" rectangles for end tabs
- 2" x 5" rectangle for tab



Who's Who in DPAQ – Lyn Bates

How long have you been quilting and how did you get started?

Both my Grandmother and my Mother were very skilled dressmakers. I made my first dolls' clothes on Grandma's lovely treadle machine and began making my own clothes as a teenager and later my children's clothes. The love of quilting, however, came from my daughter, Keri, who lived for a while in Alice Springs where she took up quilting and jam making. She started sending me fat quarters (what do I do with those?), so I played tit for tat and sent her a pile of small print Christmas fabrics which I thought would do for the tops of the jam jars. Then back came the photo of those (very ordinary I must admit) fabrics which had been transformed into a beautiful big 'Around the World' Christmas quilt! She won. So, the Feb 2001 meeting of DP & Q saw me join up to begin my quilting journey with the nicest group of girls you could hope to find. Lesley Every joined up the same night so I knew I was on the right track!



Who or what has inspired you most in your techniques, style, colour choices, creative journey etc.

Initially what inspired me were the astonishing pieces of workmanship which appeared from under the chairs at the monthly club meetings! That night I would have visions of quilts to create flashing through my mind - which by morning had evaporated. Photographic fixative was sadly absent. However, some of these talented ladies would then demonstrate their techniques at Saturday Stitchers. I couldn't overstate just how valuable I believe the knowledge that is so generously imparted by fellow members at these monthly sessions really is. Lesley and I ran them for about 4 years and the techniques presented were varied and exciting, as they still are today, and thank you to all involved. Do participate, they are fun.

Then came Gloria Loughman, Pam Holland, Michelle Marvig and their great use of fabrics and colours; trips to Melbourne and the wonderful Jenny Bowker with her joy in free-motion organic style quilting, backed up by Helen Godden and Deborah Louie with their very different approach. I love colour and I love quilting.



What's your biggest accomplishment / favourite piece of work?

In the TQ 2009 Exhibition I was awarded the prize for "Keeping the Traditions" for a quilt I had made for my niece's birthday. Unfortunately, by the time I was told it was to go to the National Exhibition in Melbourne it was already on its way to Queensland. Drat! However, my biggest thrill was in 2017 when at the Royal Darwin Show I won Champion Quilt – and my granddaughter, Emma, won Champion Junior Craft Exhibit with her first quilting project. Younger granddaughter, Georgia, was then inspired to successfully enter her first quilt in TQ17 and the Royal Darwin Show. What more could you want?



What are you most complimented on?

In 2007 Gloria Loughman gave me a Highly Commended and told me she loved my quilting and in TQ17 I was awarded the "Best Domestic Machine Quilting".





What would be one piece of advice you would give to someone starting their quilting journey?

Do participate in Saturday Stitchers and visiting workshops which cost so little compared with travelling south to attend classes.

What is your latest project?

A small row-by-row quilt for the newly arrived granddaughter, Alice. Need to add a unicorn I think – or should that be a white rabbit carrying a large clock? Got to inspire her to enter quilts in the shows too you know!
