



## Requirements for Saturday Stitches

**AUGUST 15, 2020** 

10am TO 2pm

**TUTOR: Christine Garrett** 

STITCH EMBELLISHED BAG

#### Requirements:

Outer fabric: Plain or Blender - 18" x 12" (so the decorative stitching can stand out)

Medium weight Iron-on Interfacing - 18" x 12"

Lots of different colours and types of threads (this is a good chance to use up reels that are close to finished).

Assorted 15" lengths of cord, wool, ricrac, ribbon etc....one piece of each will do.

I have also added buttons and beads and some hand embroidery, but this can be done after stitching is done and is optional.

If you wish to turn it into a bag this size, you will also need:

1 x Fat Quarter for lining and a pocket.

18" x 12" piece of Soft and Stable (foam like stuff for bags), peltex (a heavy bag pellon), batting of your choice or a couple of layers of heavy interfacing (so the bag can stand upright on its own).

#### **General Supplies:**

Sewing machine in good working order with decorative stitches if possible, an embroidery foot/open toe (usually a clear foot). If not your normal/general sewing foot will do.


Machine needles for 12wt or Metallic threads eg. 90 or 100 with a large eye




## Library news


Two new books, ( Voyage - A Trip Around the Wool)

Guidelines for 96A Winnellie Rd, Winnellie

This is a reminder of our obligations when at 96A

On arrival at 96A
Sanitize your hands
Sign in with your arrival time
Unlock kitchen cupboards and set up kettle tea and coffee

Set yourself up with table, chair, power etc. (Adjust your chair)
Things to remember during the day

Use of DPAQ Equipment - there is plenty of equipment which has been purchased by DPAQ and is available for you to use, eg. Irons, ironing boards, rulers, cutting mats, light box etc. Take care when using.

Some equipment may be borrowed for a short time - sign equipment out with a committee member and back in, ensuring it is returned in good condition

Irons - use tap water to fill irons and empty before putting away

Cutting tables - please ensure blinds are down at all times as the sun damages the cutting mats

rulers to be put away after use place fabric scraps in bin for use making dogs beds

Photocopy - there is a cost to use the copier and a container for your money.

Kitchen - DPAQ supplies tea and coffee for your convenience.

please keep the kitchen clean at all times.

payment for drinks in the fridge is \$1 each, leave in plastic container
the fridge will be cleaned frequently and any food and containers left in
the fridge will be disposed of

At the end of the day your responsibilities are to put away your chair, wipe table with sanitiser and put away
sweep floor and pick up threads around you
sign out

Closing 96A - Check the floor has been cleaned (vacuumed or swept properly)
rubbish is to be taken home
coffee tea and Kettle are put away
fridge and kitchen cupboards are locked

Enjoy your day at these very special sewing days. Be respectful of others, everyone comes to work on their own projects. Ask for help but remember sewing days are not classes,

Drink lots of water and wash your hands often.

Cyanotype take2 (blue printing or sun printing)

The cyanotype process uses a mixture of iron compounds, which when exposed to UV light and washed in water oxidise to create Prussian Blue ...pictures are of my dilly bag sun printed on cotton and the flowers were copied on a 3d printer, converted to a negative and sun printed on cotton.

#### Norwegian Fish Soup - Lillian Furre

The perfect recipe for a busy quilter:

#### **Ingredients**

2 potatoes
2 carrots
½ pcs celery root
1 onion
2 garlic cloves
1 I ready-mixed fish broth
1 tsp salt
½ ts pepper
300 ml Light Cream or Light Crème Fraîche 18%
400 g fish Eg. salmon, snapper, mussels or shrimp

To serve
1 tablespoon finely chopped chives (can be omitted)

Here's how to do it

Start by peeling and grating potatoes, carrots and celery coarsely, or cut them into thin strips. Finely chop the onion and cut the garlic into thin slices.

Put ready-mixed fish broth and vegetables in a saucepan. Let simmer for 5-10 minutes. Add salt and pepper.

Tips

200 ml of the broth can be replaced with white wine if you wish.

Add cream or Crème Fraîche and bring to the boil just before serving. In the meantime, cut the fish into suitable large pieces.

Tips

Use cod, snapper or for example salmon - depending on what you have available or what you want. If you think the soup is too thin, smooth with cornstarch before serving. Stir 1-2 teaspoons of cornstarch in 50 ml cold water. Once you have got it lump-free, add it to the soup in a steady stream while stirring constantly.

Add the fish pieces, take the pot away from the plate and let the fish soak in the soup for approx. 5 minutes until the fish is barely done.


Tips

If you want to have in shrimp, add them just before serving. Decorate with chives or other herbs






#### Visitors welcome




