- Binding cut 2 ½" x WOF
- · Sharpie Pens Fine but not super Fine.

Colour, Thread and Free Motion Quilting by Terri Lucas DP&Q Library #1398


Book review from Jenny Armour

This new addition to the library has exciting ideas and is also strong on theory, especially on colour values. Subtitled Learn to stitch with reckless abandon it would appear not for the faint-hearted, but permission to play and experiment is constantly given.

Behind every good quilter is a solid knowledge about needles, thread composition and weight, and machine tension. Given a number of years we can all work this out for ourselves, but in this book it is concisely explained with photographic examples and even a photo of quilting gone wrong so why would you wait. I especially valued her comments on the effects of humidity on thread. I don't remember anyone addressing this before.

Conversely, she did not reference dry air with the need to leave your reel of thread outdoors during the Dry to help it absorb moisture from the dew. In this book, the quilting becomes the design itself in many examples, though enhancing your patchwork with quilting is covered too. There are some gadgets you may want to buy, and more than a little homage is paid to threads, needles and spool holders designed and marketed by Superior Threads, which I would thoroughly endorse but which might seem over-thetop for some readers.

The book has been published this year by C&T, so a good pedigree, and I can guarantee everyone will learn something from this book.







Recipe for October

Home made paw paw salad - made after watching the ladies at the Darwin

markets make it. I make one a chilli salad

1 small green paw paw
1 tablespoon - brown sugar or palm sugar
1 tablespoon - fish sauce
Garlic - to taste
1 tablespoon - lime juice
1 teaspoon - sesame oil
tomato wedges - 1 punnet or equivelent
Chilli - however many you like
beans - handful
peanuts - handful

Mix in a large bowl garlic, beans, sugar, fish sauce, lime juice, sesame oil and chilli. Pound with pestle and mortar.

Add shredded paw paw and tomato mix again pound briefly.




