SONGLINES is founded on passions for collaboration, inclusion and textiles! To celebrate our opening we are launching a 2021 invitation to Art Quilters living in the Northern Territory with the theme "Territory Colours".

The quilts will be feature in a dedicated exhibition at SONGLINES from mid-November to Christmas 2021. No entry fee is required but quilts on exhibition will be available for sale, with a commission of 30% of the sale price payable to the Gallery.

How to jump on board:

 Participation: We need to receive your completed Expression of Interest form to participate, by 15th May 2021. Although this will not be binding it will help us in planning. We will require firm confirmation of participation by 1st September 2021. Submission forms will be distributed then.
 Lodgement: Each completed quilt will be accompanied by a submission form and must be delivered to SONGLINES by close of business, Tuesday 2nd November 2021.
 Exhibition and display: The entries will be displayed at SONGLINES, 55 Stuart Highway, Stuart Park, in

November/December 2021. An opening will be held to celebrate. Dates will be confirmed before the end of August.

Specifications for entry are: • Theme: The maker's design will address the theme "Territory Colours".

- Original: The quilt must be of an original design by the maker; commercial patterns and/or designs will not be accepted.
- New work: The quilt will not have been previously shown in any public exhibition.
- Quilt & materials: The quilt must meet the definition of "quilt" that is, comprising three layers - being top, internal layer and backing forming a 'sandwich' held together with stitching.
 Materials used in the quilt and embellishments must be able to

be displayed safely and be expected to be durable.

- Size: The quilt may be any shape but its finished size should not exceed 60cms high and 60cm wide.
- Permissions: In the event that the maker wishes to make use of a photograph or other artwork by another artisan in developing her/his design, evidence of written permission from the photographer/artisan will be a pre-requisite for the quilt being accepted for the exhibition.
- Hanging: A hanging sleeve, minimum 5cm deep x width of the quilt, must be attached to the top of the quilt, on the back.
 Information: Each quilt will have a label attached to the back
- with the quilt's title (if any), the name of the maker, and date of completion.

Packing: Each quilt must be submitted in a customised quilt bag allowing the quilt to be packed flat and with a secure fastening (eg, zip or Velcro closing,) with a photo of the quilt, and the maker's name and contact details, attached to the front.
Interpretation: Each quilt will displayed accompanied by an artist's statement, of up to 100 words, about the quilt. Please provide an artist bio for inclusion in exhibition information.
Quantity: Makers are not limited to one entry, however we cannot commit to displaying more than one. You are welcome to submit up to four entries.

 Selling: All quilts submitted for inclusion will be available for sale. They will be consigned to SONGLINES and remain the property of the artist. The participant will indicate a Retail Price that will include a 30% commission (plus GST) to Songlines.
