



Community Project Announcement from Jasmine Jan (Territory Wildlife Park Artist)



ommunity Slow Stitched Quilt – Territory Wildlife Park



Territory Wildlife Park is seeking expressions of interest from crafters, patchworkers, quilters and textile artists who are interested in participating in the creation of a slow-stitched 3 metre wide X 1.2 metre high quilt. The quilt will be constructed from 100 small slow stitched blocks that measure 15cm wide X 23cm high (6 inch x 9 inch).

A community quilt telling the story of the mighty Adelaide River highlighting the saltwater crocodile and other plants and animals that live on, in and around this river system using a combination of slow stitched hand-dyed fabrics.

There will a fee of \$5 per block to cover the basic materials kit which will consist of a calico back panel and some pieces of hand-dyed Shibori fabrics. Panels will be available from mid-Oct and slow stitched panels will need to be returned to the Park by the start of Dec. The slow stitch panel kits will also come with an explanation of what techniques, materials, embellishments can be used and the colour palette. The overall colour theme will be shades of blues and white to tie in with the Shibori dyed pieces that will be included in the kit.

Construction of the final quilt will take place in January-February with an unveiling event at the Territory Wildlife Park aquarium in March. Date to be advised. All contributors will be invited to the unveiling event.

Saturday Stitches with Janelle Northcott

16 October, 2021 10am to 2pm

In this you will be learning some free motion quilting techniques and breaking down designs to make them easier.



- **Requirements:**
- Two quilt sandwiches approximately 20" x 20" These should be plain fabric so that the quilting will stand out. The backing should be similar so that you can judge your tension. These sandwiches can be pin or machine basted
- A small quilt sandwich to test your tension
- Thread to contrast your chosen fabric
- Sewing machine in good working order
- Extension table if available
- A new needle (and an old needle)
- A scrap book with blank pages or scrap paper
- Writing equipment
- A fabric marker that will show on your fabric
- General sewing supplies






Library news



Fibonacci Poem - Brien Bilston




a poem on a page but then each line grew to the word sum of the previous two


